### HISTORY AND PERSPECTIVE

- Alberta was 1.5 million in 1970 and is now over 4.1 million
- Alberta had about 100,000 unemployed in August of 1970 and about 100,000 unemployed in August of 2013!
- To March of this year, Alberta created just over 87% of all of the net new jobs in Canada during the previous 12 months.
- Alberta has generated approximately 500,000 new jobs in the past decade.
- Alberta is expected to reach 5 million in 2021 and 6 million in 2027
- Aberta's GDP will likely be the second largest economy in Canada before the end of the decade.
