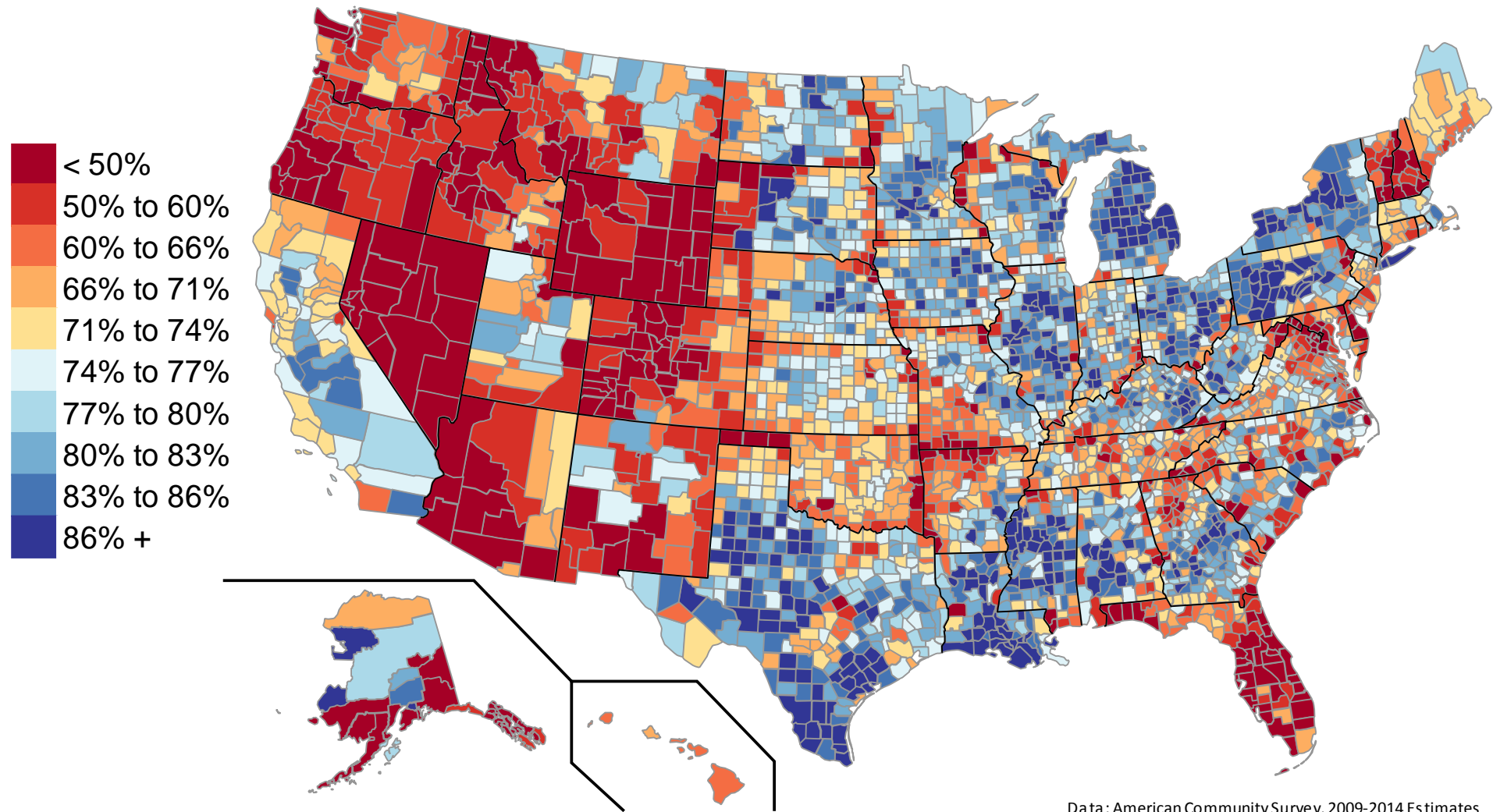

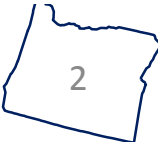

# U.S. Born Population Living in State of Birth, 2014



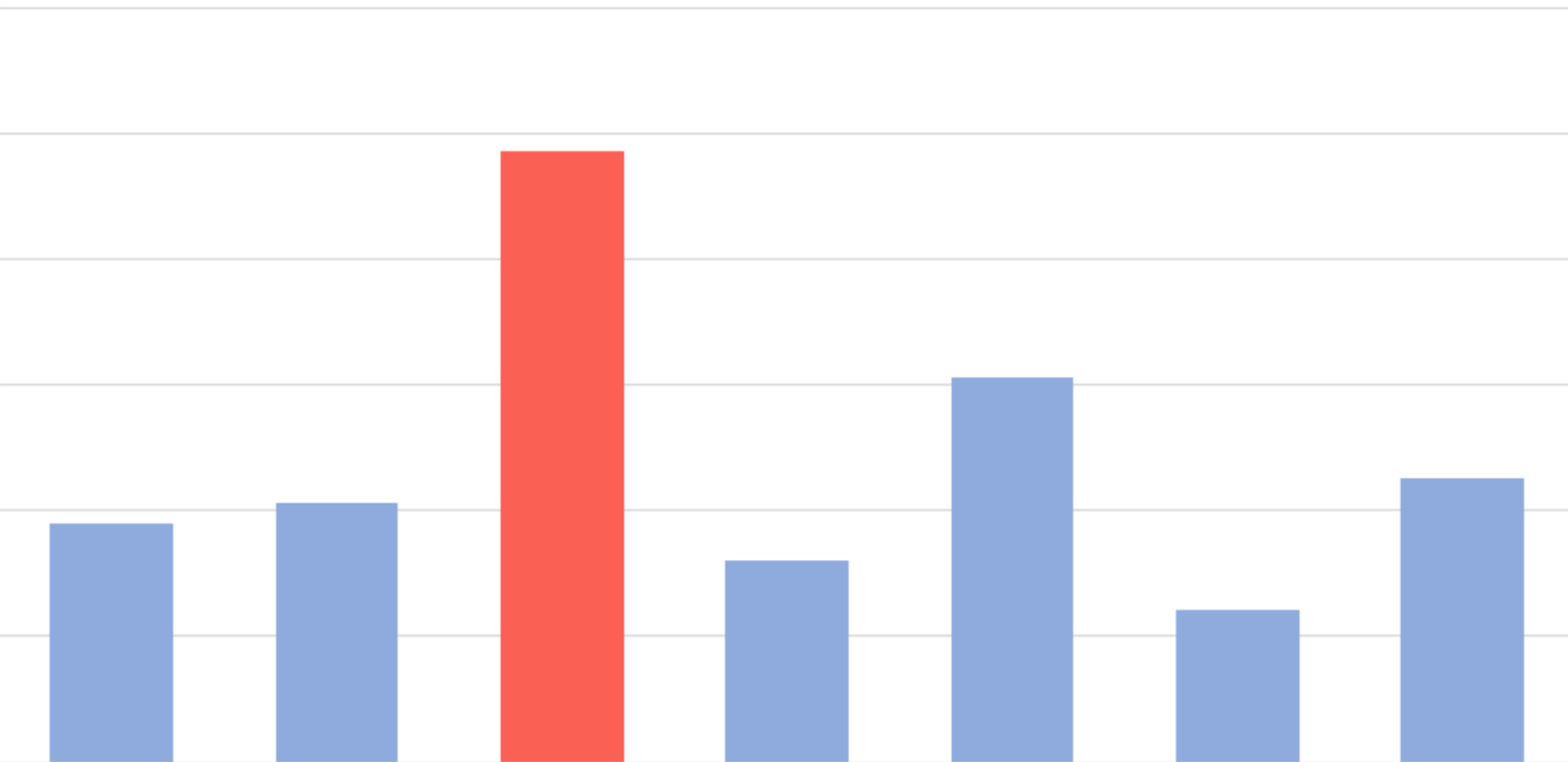

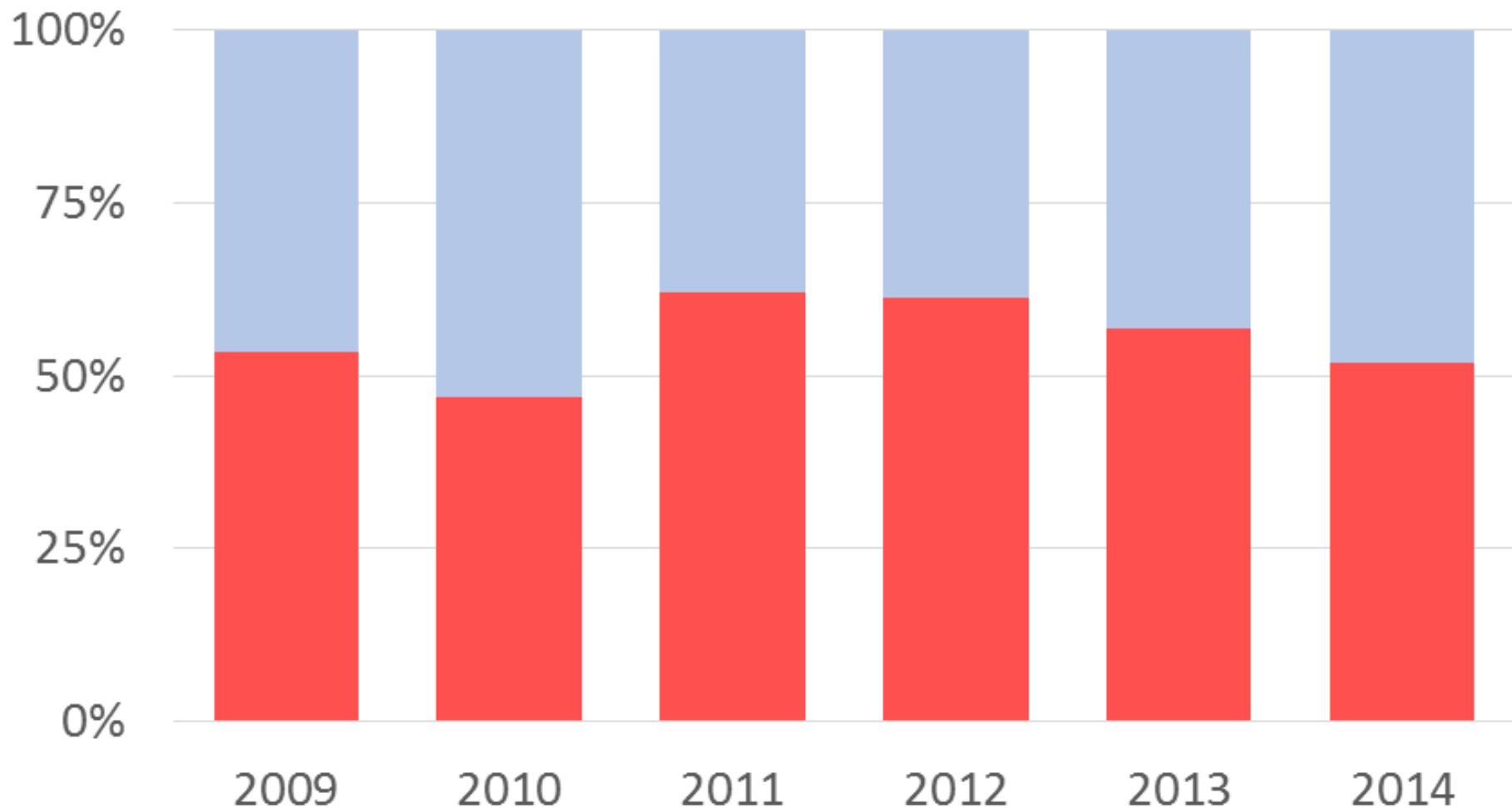

■ STEM+ Degrees    ■ All Other Degrees

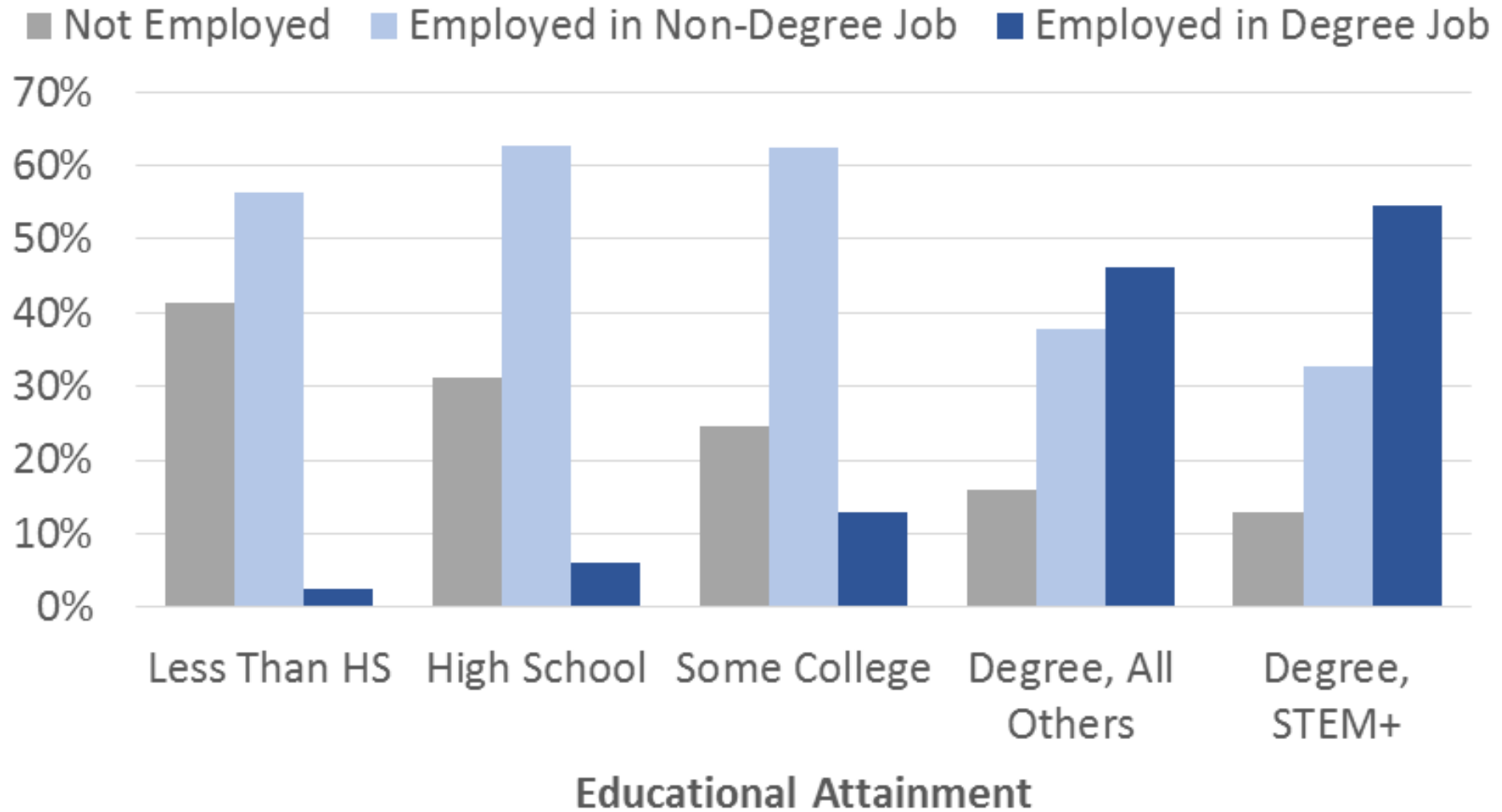

25-39 Year Olds, 2014

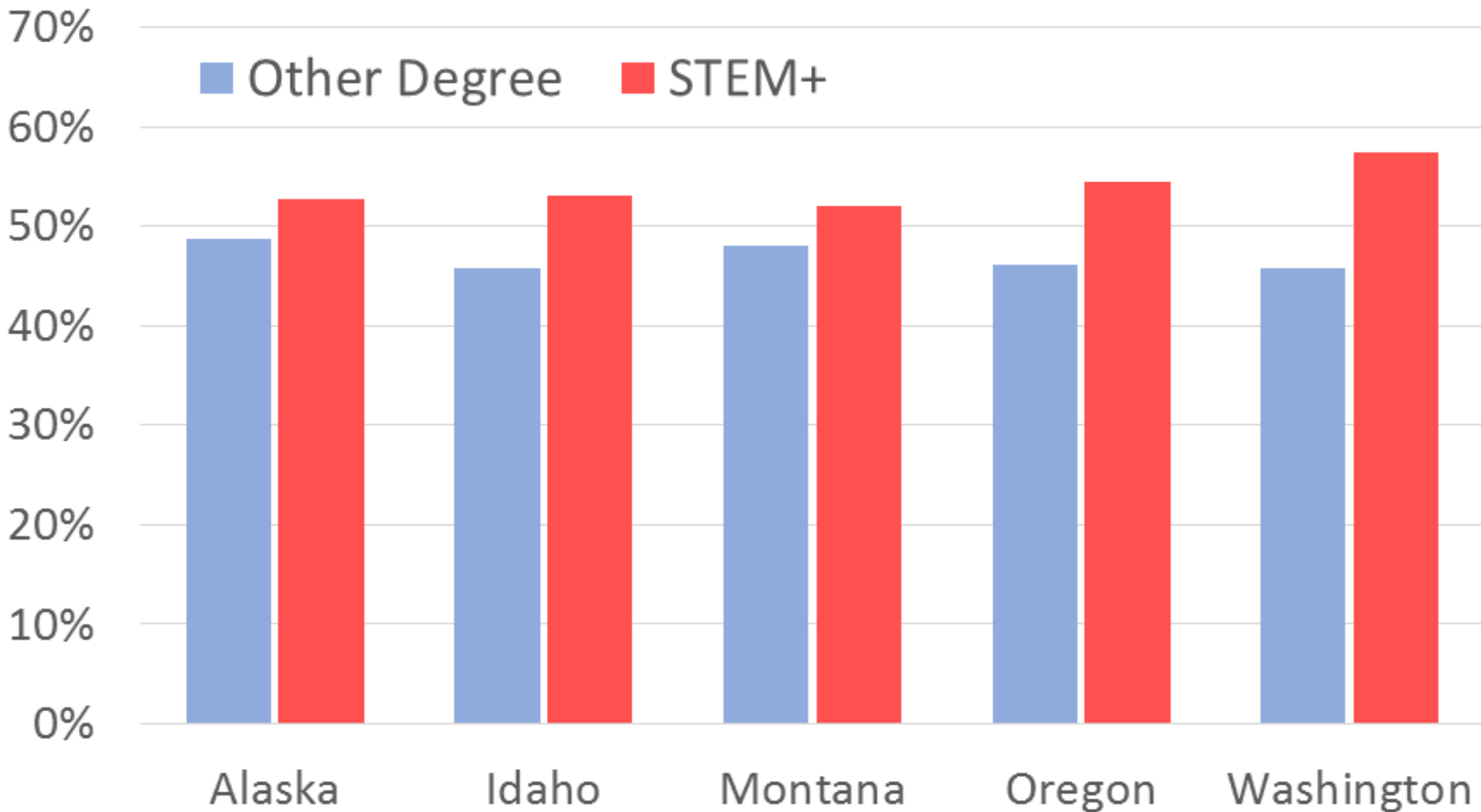

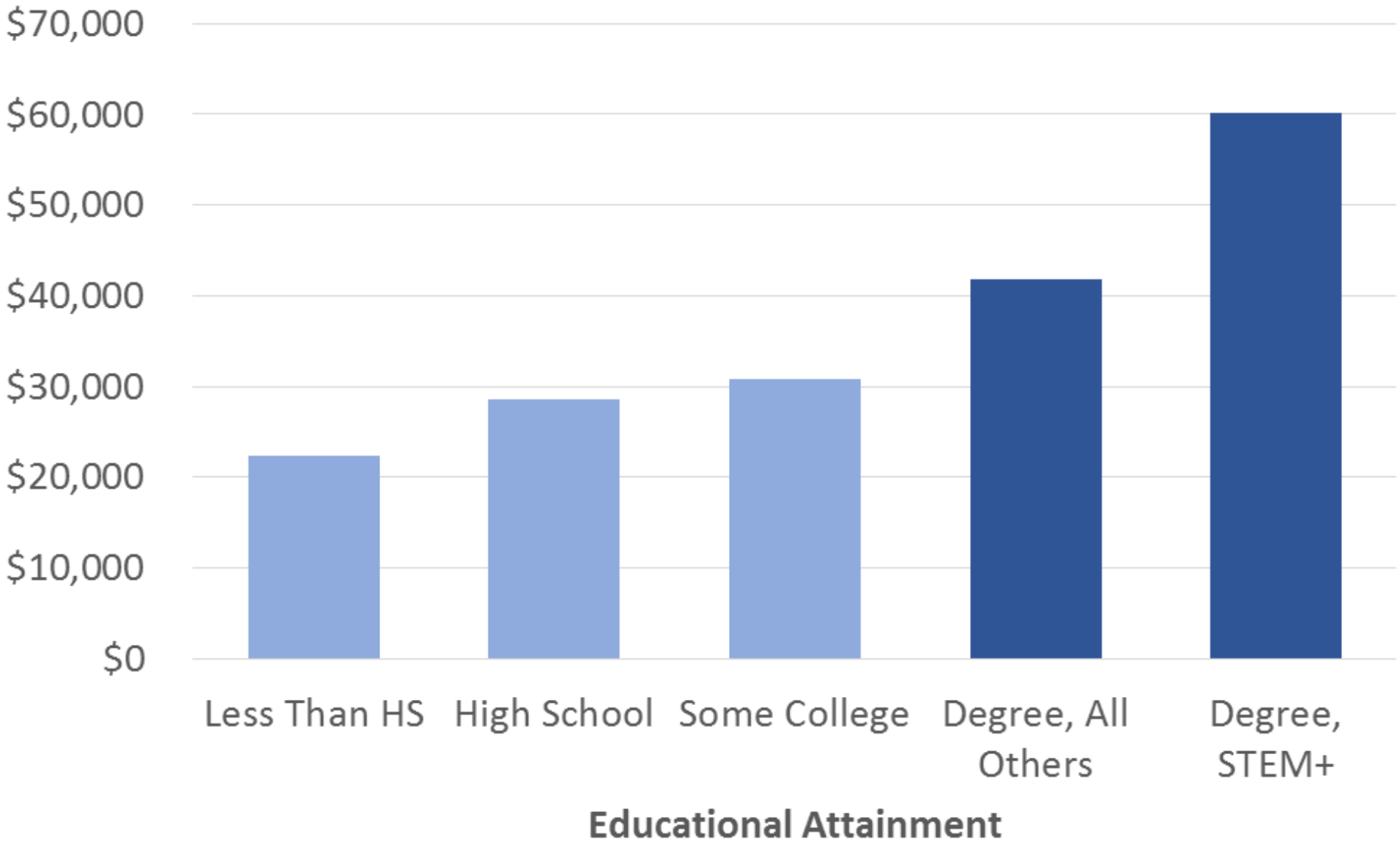
# PNW and Degree Jobs

# Average Wages by Educational Attainment

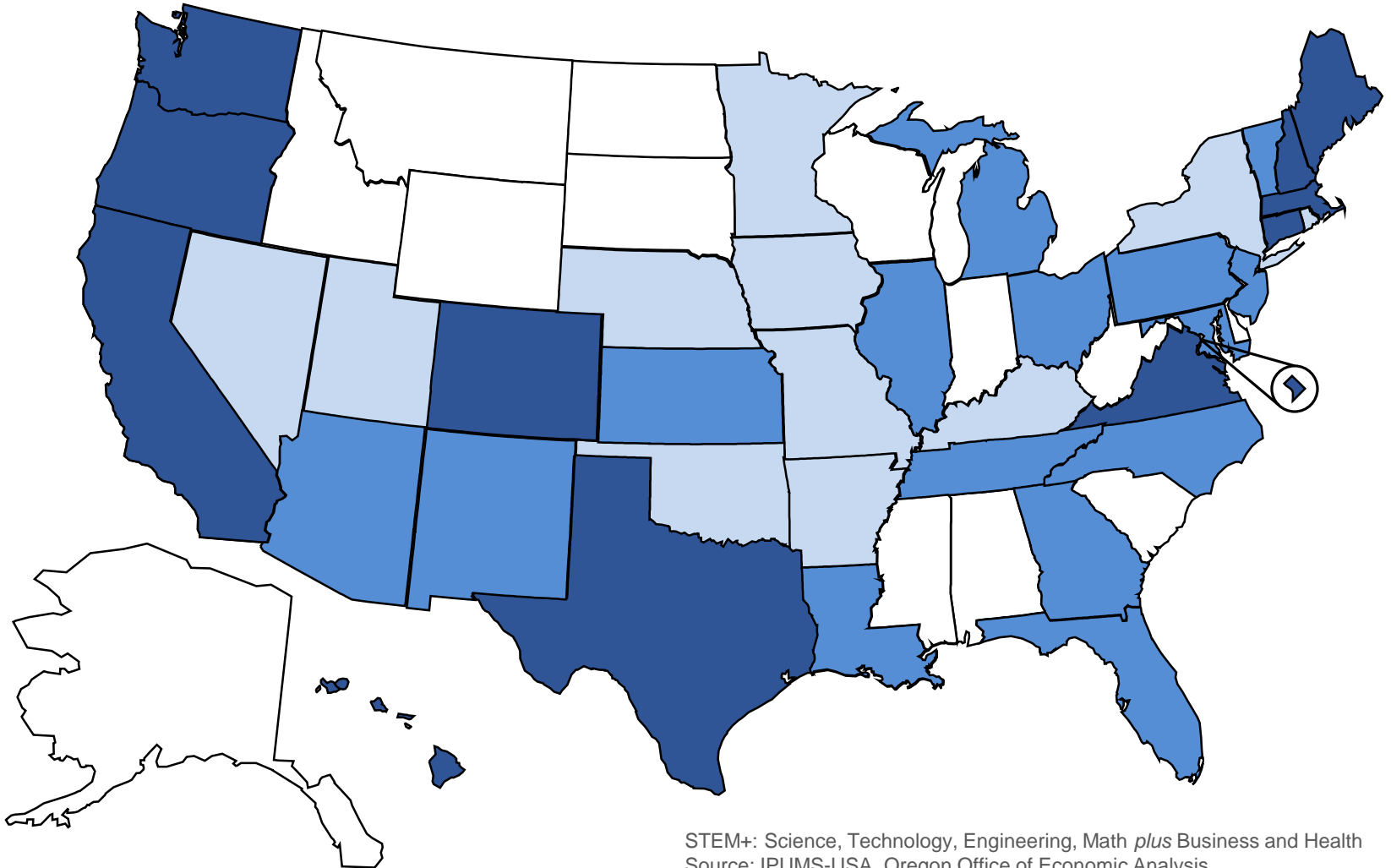
25-39 Year Old Oregonians, All Workers (PT and FT), 2014
