

#### U.S. Born Population Living in State of Birth, 2014




Domestic Net Migration by Age


Net Migration, 20-39 Year Olds, Bachelor's or Higher

#### 25-39 Year Olds, 2014



# **PNW and Degree Jobs**


Share of 25-39 Year Olds with a Bachelor's or More, Employed in Degree Jobs, 2014

## **Average Wages by Educational Attainment**


25-39 Year Old Oregonians, All Workers (PT and FT), 2014
