


Bend Annual Average Unemployment Rate





Nonfarm Employment: 1990




Nonfarm Employment: 2007



Adjusted to 2016 Dollars



SINGLE FAMILY HOUSING STARTS




Bend-Redmond Milken Ranking by Year






Single Family Starts - 12 TTM








WHAT CAN MEDIAN INCOME EARNERS AFFORD?




	Median Income	What Can They Afford?

Homeowners	\$66,053 (Accountant, computer programmer)	\$250,000 (including taxes, insurance, utilities)
Median Resident	\$59,400 (Elementary school teacher, firefighter)	\$1,485 monthly expense

SINGLE FAMILY HOUSING STARTS




